2nd Report on Consumer Policy and integration of consumer interests into EU policies

- adopted on 7 April 2014
- covers the period Jan 2012- Dec 2013
- Informs about the state of play and progress achieved for Consumer Agenda Actions
- Out of 62 actions, 52 have been accomplished and 10 are on-going



Product Safety Package

- No progress in Council (both at political and technical levels) due to the country of origin Article.
- 15 April the EP adopted with overwhelming majority the two Regulations in a first reading based on the IMCO Reports and amendments
- Legislative process expected to resume in the second half of the year (IT Presidency, new EP)
- EC and Member States continue to work on the implementation of the 20 actions of the Multi-Annual Plan for Market Surveillance



Revision of the medical devices legislation

- State of play:
 - > European Parliament: 1st reading vote on 2nd April 2014;
 - > Council: 28 meetings of the Council Working Party (CWP) on Pharmaceuticals and Medical Devices under CY, IE, LT and EL PRES.
- In the meantime, the Commission and the Member States have been working on the implementation of the Joint Plan for Immediate Action under the existing legislation in order to tighten up controls and improve patient safety.
- A **Staff Working Paper** will be published in June outlining the results of the Joint Plan for Immediate Action, which have been achieved until now and providing proposals for its continuation.



COSMETICS REGULATION: Public consultation on fragrance allergens *(deadline 14 May 2014)*

- In the public consultation it was proposed:
 - 1) to submit additional fragrance allergens to the obligation of individual labelling on the package (Annex III)
 - 2) to ban three fragrance allergens: HICC, atranol and chloroatranol (Annex II).
- We are now analysing the received comments. Based on the outcome, we will draft any regulatory measures needed and propose them to Member States.



CONSUMER CREDIT DIRECTIVE

- The Report on the Consumer Credit Directive was adopted on 14 May
- The main findings show that creditors should make further efforts to ensure that rights given to EU citizens are respected, in particular as regards advertisements and pre-contractual information.
- Commission to focus on raising awareness of rights and obligations, and on surveying their correct application and enforcement.



CPC REGULATION: Follow up to the public consultation

- June: A Commission Communication on the functioning of the CPC Regulation will analyse the public consultation results
- 7/8 July: IT Conference on enforcement cooperation
- Over the Autumn: the Commission is conducting impact assessment studies



CPC REGULATION:Joint enforcement actions

- In app purchases joint action
- Sweep on travel services results published on 14 April
- Other joint actions in the pipeline (i.e. car rental)



European Consumers Summit: The EU Consumer in the Digital Era

- A big success: more than 520 participants, 8 Ministers, 2 Commissioners, 1350 tweets...
- Main feedback from the participants:
 - Digital trust (data protection/privacy)
 - Digital literacy
 - Digital enforcement

COMPARISON TOOLS

June 2012: Multi-Stakeholder Dialogue on comparison tools (MSDCT) set up

March 2013: Report and recommendations from the MSDCT presented at 2013 Consumer Summit

October 2013: launch of in-depth study

Preliminary results: more than 1040 comparison tools mapped across the EU

What's next: 26 June 2014: 6th meeting of the MSDCT where results of the study will be presented and next steps discussed



ENVIRONMENTAL CLAIMS

May 2012: Multi-Stakeholder Dialogue on Environmental Claims (MDEC) set up

March 2013: Report and recommendations from the MDEC presented at 2013 Consumer Summit

Follow-up MDEC report: Consumer market study on environmental claims (non-food)

Results being finalised (see next slide) and informal consultation with MDEC on policy recommendations

What's next: 19th June 2014: 6th meeting of MDEC to further discuss next steps



STUDY ON ENVIRONMENTAL CLAIMS: Main conclusions

- Green claims are widespread
- Limited understanding, trust mixed
- Few claims fully comply with criteria from UCPD guidance
- Enforcement not always priority but attitudes are changing
- Presence of national/sectorial guidelines positive
- Self-regulatory systems effective, especially for advertising
- → EU consumers currently not able to make informed choices and contribute to "green growth" as fully as they might
- → Suggestions for future policy work

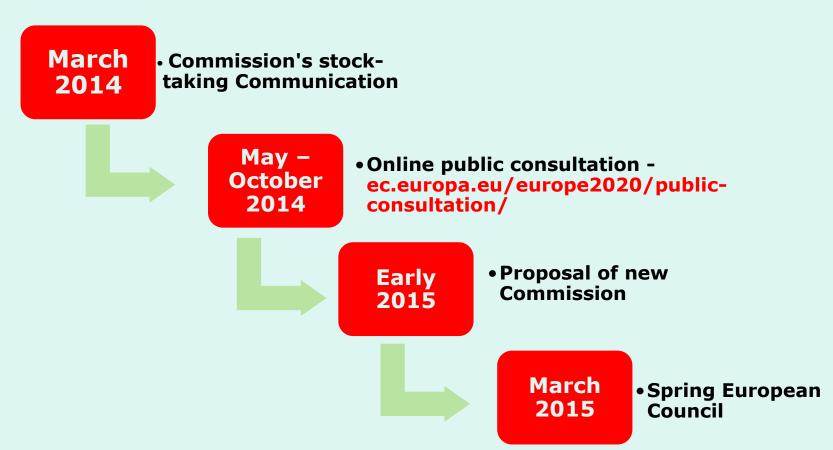
